However even at level 2 there remain some restrictions. To meet Scottish Government guidance:

- 1.Please pre-book a time slot.
- 2. The maximum number we can accommodate is 6 people from up to 3 households.
- 3. You will need to provide contact details for Test and Protect purposes.
- 4. Mandatory wearing of face-coverings (unless exempt) when not seated.

Our concept for Buddies Bothy is to make the premise available as a workshop area to be used for wood working, repairing and restoring, tinkering, or even bicycle and car restoration. A place where people can pursue practical interests, to practice and share skills and enjoy making and mending.

Based on the idea of the Men's Shed, the essence Is not in the workshop facilities themselves, but the op-

Our concept for "Buddies Bothy" is primarily about



social connections and friendship building, sharing skills and knowledge or even just an informal meeting place for a chat, a cuppa and a laugh.

We will aim to promote the Buddies Bothy as open to all and encourage it to be used for community oriented projects. While the Men's Shed movement typically attracts older retired men, many successful sheds have younger members and woman too. It will be a place open to all members of the community,

We also have the opportunity to fit out the upper space which could be used for space for arts and crafts.

To do this we have agreed a plan with the landlords to improve the space to make it more wind and water tight, relocate the stairs and bring the building into use.
